












# **Objectives**


Document the work and health experiences of low-wage workers in South LA.

Presentation to SCCHC Board of Directors










# **Patient Demographics**

# **Patient Interview Results:**

Identified dangers at work (Chemicals, Fumes, Dust, Noises, Stressors)	83%
Sick/Injured on the job	49 %
Given info about health & safety hazards in workplace and how to protect themselves	46%
Have heard or know about Cal/OSHA	17%
Have heard or know about Workers Comp.	38%

### **Common Themes**

- Stress
  - -Production quotas
  - -Long work hours
  - -Financial worries
  - -No job security

- Education
  - -Worker rights

- Underreporting of work injuries/illnesses
  - -Fear
  - -Lack of knowledge on workers rights
  - -Apathy from Employer

### **Worker Testimonies**

"Information is very important in the area of work, how to put on a back brace, how to utilize worker's compensation."

"I went to school here, I finished high school. I learned that I have rights and I knew that I wasn't being treated justly. But necessity makes you put up with it, even if you know its wrong. Jobs are not easy to come by."

# **Challenges**

- Building trust with patients
  - -explain goals of study
  - -ensure patient confidentiality

- Poor Recognition of Work place Hazards
  - -assumption of high risk as workplace norm

### **Successes**

- Achieved 124 patient interviews
- Raised Awareness through conversations
- Greater understanding of priorities and demands of CHC's
- Provided useful material to clinics and promotoras
- Greater understanding of occupational health and safety issues in South LA

### Recommendations

- Disseminate OSH materials to communityhealth fairs, clinic waiting rooms
- Educational workshops
- Provide additional OSH training for promotoras
- Build referral relationships between clinics, worker centers and other supporting agencies
